His business has increased sufficiently to enable him to keep four assistants in employment. H.S. Mar. 15, 1915.

Mr. Nelson H. Nottingham, '12, merchant tailor at Cape Charles, Va., came through Hampton a few days ago on a business trip. He brought over

with him many samples of the latest spring styles and was successful in getting some orders for spring suits. He is at present employing three Hampton men to assist in getting out his work.

H.S. April 1, 1915

THE death of Nelson Nottingham, 1912, occurred on February 8, 1919, at the State Sanitarium, Burkeville, Va., where he had gone for treatment. He was taken with influenza which developed into pneumonia and his death came very suddenly.
