

In the online service horse race it looks as if prodigy is leading in the Web lane. At the end of his month it will introduce Produgy Personal Web Pages a feature that could make every Prodigy member a Web publisher. The designers have made six Web item:

The Industry Numbering Committee responsible for this kind of thing has chosen the exchange 888 as the new toll-free code, and the new numbers go into effect April 1, 1996.

On a similar subject, all the other new area codes cropping up these days (CYBERSCOPE, 9/26/94) might cause trouble for the private phone switches called private branch exchanges, or PBXs. 



Intelligent Transportation Systems

Michael J. Demetsky, Professor, Department of Civil Engineering and Applied Mechanics

Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) use state-of-the-art or advanced technology to improve travel and safety on our Nation's surface transportation system. The national ITS program focuses on the development and deployment of a collection of twenty-nine user services. These user services have recently been classified according to seven user service bundles:

- travel and transportation management
- travel demand management
- public transportation operations
- electronic payment
- commercial vehicle operations
- emergency management and
- advanced vehicle control and safety systems.

To advance the development, testing, and ultimate deployment of these user services, the national ITS program includes initiatives by the private and public sectors. These include research and development activities, operational tests, system architecture development, institutional/policy studies, and deployment support efforts.

Because the majority of ITS projects are cooperative efforts among the private sector, government, and universities, this track will bring private companies, DOT officials and university faculty together to explore mutual interests.



Assisting Industry with Corrosion Prevention, Failure Analysis, and Materials Selection

Glenn E. Stoner, Director, Center for Electrochemical Science and Engineering (CESE)

CESE is the largest academically based program dedicated to environmental effects on engineering materials in the U.S. The center involves six faculty members, one visiting faculty, one research engineer, and one administrative staff member. We currently have \$2.6 million in research funding, 35 graduate students, and 28 corporate sponsors. However, another aspect of our center's activities involve serving industry on a short term basis (a single day up to multiyear) in the areas where industry requires an answer, a new technique, some analysis or a better understanding of some aspect of their corporate activity which becomes concerned with environmental attack of materials used in producing, containing, shipping or using their products. The presentation will focus on examples where industry has benefitted from our center in the past and will include some of the topics listed below:

- accelerated new test development
- analysis and prevention of failures during manufacture
- corrosion failures during storage
- materials selection and compatibility

In this session, we will discuss state-of-the-art design techniques including:

- logic synthesis
- design for testability
- virtual prototyping
- designing with programmed logic
- using surface mount technology









InfoSeek is a comprehensive and accurate WWW search engine. You can type your search in plain English or just enter key words and phrases. You can also use special query operators:

THE LYCOS HOME PAGE: HUNTING WWW INFORMATION

This search engine, served by Carnegie Mellon University, will allow you to search on document titles and content. Its May 1 database contains 3.75 million link descriptors and the keywords from 767,000 documents. The Lycos index is built by a Web crawler that can bring in 5000 documents per day. The index searches document title, headings, links, and keywords it locates in these documents.

WEBCRAWLER SEARCHING

This engine allows searches by document title and content. It is part of the WebCrawler project, managed by Brian Pinkerton at the University of Washington, which collects documents from the Web.



Acronym Expansion

WWW

World Wide Web (or Web, for short).

SGML

Standard Generalized Markup Language -- this is a standard for describing markup languages.

DTD

Document Type Definition -- this is a specific markup language, written using SGML.

HTML

HyperText Markup Language -- HTML is a SGML DTD. In practical terms, HTML is a collection of styles (indicated by markup tags) that define the various components of a World Wide Web document.

What This Primer Doesn't Cover

This primer assumes that you have:

- at least a passing knowledge of how to use NCSA Mosaic or some other Web browser
- a general understanding of how Web servers and client browsers work
- access to a Web server for which you would like to produce HTML documents, or that you wish to produce HTML documents for personal use

Creating HTML Documents

HTML documents are in plain (also known as ASCII) text format and can be created using any text editor (e.g., Emacs or vi on UNIX machines). A couple of Web browsers

(tkWWW for X Window System machines and CERN's Web browser for NeXT computers) include rudimentary HTML editors in a WYSIWYG environment. There are also some WYSIWIG editors available now (e.g. HotMetal for Sun Sparcstations, HTML Edit for Macintoshes). You may wish to try one of them first before delving into the details of HTML.

You can preview a document in progress with NCSA Mosaic (and some other Web browsers). Open it with the **Open Local** command under the **File** menu.

After you edit the source HTML file, save the changes. Return to NCSA Mosaic and Reload the document. The changes are reflected in the on-screen display.

The Minimal HTML Document

Here is a bare-bones example of HTML:

<TITLE>The simplest HTML example</TITLE> <H1>This is a level-one heading</H1> Welcome to the world of HTML.
This is one paragraph.<P> And this is a second.<P>

HTML uses markup tags to tell the Web browser how to display the text. The above example uses:

- the <TITLE> tag (and corresponding </TITLE> tag), which specifies the title of the document
- the <H1> header tag (and corresponding </H1>)
- the <P> paragraph-separator tag

HTML tags consist of a left angle bracket (<), (a "less than" symbol to mathematicians), followed by name of the tag and closed by a right angular bracket (>). Tags are usually paired, e.g. <H1> and </H1>. The ending tag looks just like the starting tag except a slash (/) precedes the text within the brackets. In the example, <H1> tells the Web browser to start formatting a level-one heading; </H1> tells the browser that the heading is complete.

The primary exception to the pairing rule is the <P> tag. There is no such thing as </P>.

NOTE: *HTML is not case sensitive.* <title> *is equivalent to* <TITLE> *or* <TiTlE>.


